




## Mother's Day Event
















## Alzheimer's Workshops Series


The Alzheimer's Association and Fresno Housing partnered in bringing a three-part workshop series for residents to learn about the disease.

## Fresno State Parent University began offering Adult Digital Literacy Classes for FH residents

The digital literacy classes teach residents basic computer skills, including creating and using emails, monitoring student school progress through parent portal, and utilizing virtual meeting platforms such as Zoom, Google Meet, and Microsoft Teams. The eight-class course meets twice a week for four weeks. Upon completion, residents will receive a certificate and have an opportunity to participate in an advanced class for additional learning.
